

# Interpretivist-Experientialism

## Interpretivist-Experientialism Language:

“The child is the starting-point, the center, and the end. His development, his growth, is the ideal. It alone furnishes the standard.”

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Interpretivist-Experientialists recognize the learning process is a culmination of multi-content social interactions designed to foster each student’s individuality and potential as lifelong critical-thinkers and problem-solvers prepared to improve society.

## Supporting Data:

A 2014 study by “Education Evolving” showed that:

- “Three out of four study schools, graduation rates for Latinos, ELL, and low-income students ranged from 10 to 24 percentage points higher than the state averages.”
- “Survey data from the graduates in the study suggested that their school’s practices of relationship building, high standards, deeper learning, and instructional relevance contributed to their success in college.”

- Encourages student collaboration & community awareness

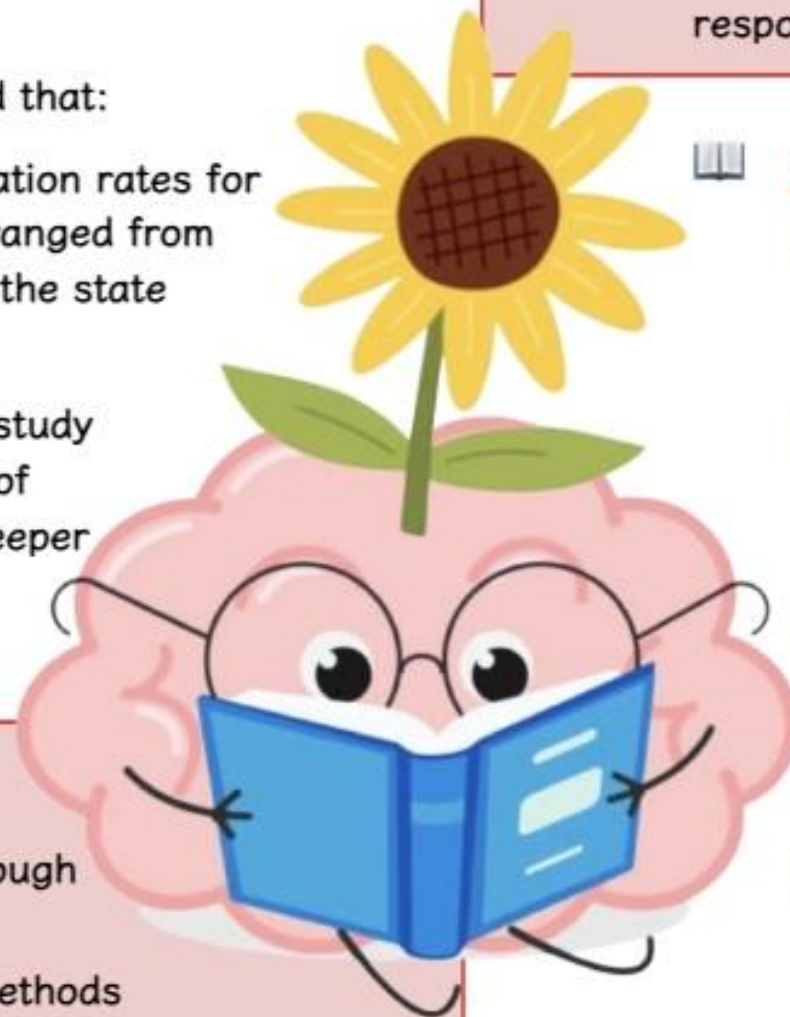
## Goals & Objectives:
